



## ACE Access

Once admitted into ACE, students will:

- be given guaranteed enrollment for ALL ACE courses.
- have the freedom to choose among ACE courses, which are never scheduled on Fridays or in the evenings.
- have access to their own study lounge & mobile computer lab.
- begin a two-year transfer-track program of courses.
- be assigned one dedicated counselor for their two years in ACE.
- take courses as a member of the ACE community.
- continue to pay only \$20 per unit.

# Achieving College Excellence

Achieving College Excellence (ACE) is a new program at GCC that provides students with opportunities to learn as part of a community. ACE students will co-register in courses with instructors who work together to provide a theme-based, integrated curriculum each semester. The program spans two years and is designed to help students transfer to the university of their choice.

The first ACE cadre begins with a Tuesday–Thursday program from July 24 to August 23, 2007. This bridge program will include a Student Development course, Math Anxiety course, and several field trips around Southern California.
