information and mail to:

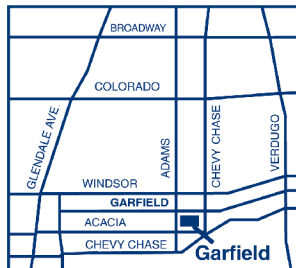
