Extended Opportunity Program and Services (EOPS) provides educational opportunities for non-traditional students who are educationally and economically disadvantaged. EOPS provides support services for students who demonstrate the potential to succeed in higher education.

## Services available:

### Counseling

- Assessment
- Academic and vocational planning
- Personal counseling
- 30-minute appointments
- EOPS priority registration
- Priority tutoring—extra hours of help with those difficult classes

### Transfer

- Contact with college and university representatives
- Campus visits
- Fee waivers for UC & CSU admissions applications
- Application assistance
