The minimum requirements for an adult high school diploma from Glendale

College are as follows:

English (9, 10, 11, 12)	40 credits
Mathematics (9 or higher)	20 credits
Science (10 or higher)	20 credits
World History	10 credits
U.S. History	10 credits
American Government	5 credits
Economics	5 credits
Electives	50 credits
Art, Music, Foreign Language	10 credits
Career Preparation	5 credits
Computer Application	5 credits

A minimum of 20 credits must be completed in residence. Credit courses taken at Glendale Community College may count as courses completed in residence.

The **General Education Development Tests (GED)** can give you the opportunity to earn a high school equivalency certificate and may reduce the number of elective courses you need for a high school diploma. The GED Tests are five tests in the areas of Language Arts, Writing; Language Arts, Reading; Social Studies; Science; and Mathematics. The GED Test is given monthly at the Garfield Campus.
