QUICK START PROJECT

The purpose of the Career Technical Education/Economic and Workforce Development Pathways Quick Start Project is to bring awareness to high school students about the various technology certificate programs available to students to enter careers that require technology skills. The certificate programs at Glendale Community College (GCC) are: Architecture, Computer Aided Manufacturing/ Machine Technology, Computer Integrated Manufacturing, Electronics & Computer Technology, Engineering, and Welding/Metallurgy. These programs are available to high school and GCC students, as well as the community. The goal of this program is to recruit high school students to get an early start with their college courses and become aware of the opportunities available to them now and when they transfer. These programs will help prepare students to enter careers related to the field of technology. There will be many events to enlighten students to see how technology can be used in various fields. For example, in Fall 2006 there was a Tech Expo at GCC where high school students had made robots and had a competition. There were also presentations by the various programs on campus, such as Machine Technology where current GCC students made a GCC keychain bottle opener. There will also be a Robotics Spring Classic event on Saturday, May 19, 2007. At this event students from Clark Magnet High School will have a competition with the robots they made in their Introduction to Engineering class.
